Early Help is a way of working with families which has a process. Practitioners need to know how to identify emerging needs and assess the level of support required for the family. All practitioners that work with families should record the presenting issues, the assessed level of need and what action is taken.

- Apply strength-based practice in work with families
- Requesting Help, Support and Protection from the Local Authority
- Feel more confident working within the early help process.
